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| <p>10th January</p> | <p>Counting in tens Use the hundred-number square to count in tens from 0 to 100 and back to 0. Challenge: Try and count forward and back in tens to 100 without the hundred-number square.</p> |
| <p>17th January</p> | <p>Counting in tens Use 10p coins to count in tens up to one hundred. Challenge: Use 10p coins to count back in tens from one hundred by taking ten pence pieces away one at a time.</p> |
| <p>24th January</p> | <p>Number bonds to ten Play 'Ping Pong'. Start off saying 'ping' and your child replies with 'pong'. Repeat/reverse and then convert to numbers. Example: say '2' and they reply '8' adding numbers to ten. Extension: Play 'Ping pong' to 20.</p> |
| <p>31st January</p> | <p>Money Recognise the coins 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p. See how many ways they can make 10p using 1p coins, 2p coins, 5p coins and 10p coins. Example: $1p + 1p + 1p + 1p + 1p + 5p = 10p$ $2p + 2p + 1p + 5p = 10p$ Challenge: See how many ways they can make 20p using 1p coins, 2p coins, 5p coins, 10p coins and 20p coins.</p> |
| <p>7th February</p> | <p>Counting in twos Use 2p coins to count in twos up to twenty. Challenge: Use 2p coins to count in twos beyond 20.</p> |
