


Games will take place outside. Your child should bring in jogging bottoms for the colder months to stay warm.

Experts state that children who read <u>at least</u> 20 minutes per day and have a 90% comprehension rate (on their quizzes), will make accelerated progress in reading

Spelling


- Spelling will be taught three days a week

Reading Records – to be handed in fortnightly

Regular reading provides numerous benefits for children, including:

- enhanced language development
- cognitive growth (memory, creativity, stimulates the brain)
- emotional intelligence self-esteem, relaxation, increased empathy.

It fosters a love of learning, improves focus, and helps children better understand themselves and the world around them.

School Uniform

Attending every day matters!

There is a very clear link between attending in all year groups and achieving well in school. In fact, sustaining 96% attendance means a pupil is more likely to reach the expected standard in both English and Maths than a pupil who is at 90%.

Good News...

As a school, we are 96% and this is **above** national. Mrs Sharrock is proud of that as children want to come to school.

- Mrs Sharrock does not authorise holidays as per statutory attendance guidance from the DFE and only authorise for:
 - Exceptional/Rare/Short
 - Unavoidable circumstances

Mrs Sharrock has written a new attendance policy with the heads from the locality to ensure consistency across all the locals schools.

PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE IS CHANGING

FIRST OFFENCE

1

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.



SECOND OFFENCE (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate will be offered.

The following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.



THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates; fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a Parents future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education'.

10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHOURISED ABSENCE IN A 10-WEEK PERIOD

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthourised absence in a 10-week period.
