- Said something to you or have you heard something that has upset you?
- Made you feel uncomfortable about how or where they have touched you?
- Hit, smacked, punched, touched or hurt you in any way?
- Sent you an unkind message or picture that has upset you?
- From the internet asked you to do anything that has made you feel uncomfortable?

What you should do



- You must tell someone you trust in your family or at school.

- Don't keep your worries a secret, even if a grown up tells you to.



School adults will not think your worry is silly. No worry is too small and you can talk to us about anything that is upsetting you. We will do our very best to keep you safe and well.
